STANDING STRONG



Eph 6:10-13, ESV – ¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm.

DIGGING DEEPER

2 Cor 12:8-10, ESV – ⁸ Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. ⁹ But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. ¹⁰ For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

Col 1:11, ESV – ¹¹ Being strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy.



When reading passages about the "warfare" of life, we see that our battle is not a flesh battle, but a spiritual battle. Why is this important to remember when interacting with other people (spouse, family, friends, co-workers, etc.)?
Why does Paul instruct us to be watchful? How does the devil scheme and "prowl around"?
TAKING IT HOME
Paul's exhortation to put on the full armor of God should be done in preparation for battle. The goal and purpose are to stand firm in the midst of spiritual warfare. In what ways do you stand firm? In what ways do you give in? what can you do about the later? Share what God is teaching you with an accountability partner and pray together.
